It is disturbing to read that tens of thousands of new images or videos are put on the internet every week and that hundreds of thousands of searches for child sexual images are performed daily. This alone identifies the importance of the League's campaign to ensure government representatives at all levels are constantly reminded of the League's position on victimization of children which is in epidemic proportion.

You can be involved by sending a postcard to the Minister of Justice expressing your concern for the proliferation of pornography and its harmful effects on society. To have the greatest impact, please ensure your name and return address are on the postcard in order for the Minister to respond to you. Ask a question or ask for feedback from the Minister (i.e., Will you take a standing by helping to ensure that just punishment is given to the perpetrators of this heinous crime to children and women?) JUBILEE YEAR OF MERCY - DECEMBER 8, 2015 - NOVEMBER 20, 2016

The Holy Father entreats the Lord to make the Jubilee of Mercy a year of grace so that the Church, "with renewed enthusiasm, may bring good news to the poor, proclaim liberty to captives and the oppressed, and restore sight to the blind." (Vatican Radio 06/05/2015, 13:33)

St. Francis C.W.L. is part of the Hamilton Diocesan Council. To celebrate the Holy Year of Mercy, each diocese of Ontario has been asked to choose a Blessed named by Pope Francis and study the life of the Blessed. Hamilton Diocese has chosen "Blessed Francisca de Paula de Jesus Isabel" (1808-95), a Brazilian laywoman also known as Nha' Chica, who was beatified on May 4, 2013 in Baependi, Brazil. The illiterate daughter of a freed slave, she developed a deep bond with the Blessed Mother when she was orphaned at age ten. Spurning marriage proposals in order to devote herself entirely to God, she led a quiet life of prayer and service as a laywoman. In time, others sought her prayers and counsel. Her simple life was totally dedicated to God and to charity, so much so that she was called "mother of the poor".
