#### From the Pastor's Desk:

I enjoy learning about the history of our faith and its traditions, and I most especially enjoy what is best described as "Catholic Trivia" those little tidbits of information that often times heighten my curiosity to learn more. It is also interesting to see how much our faith has, and continues to, influence all areas of life both secular and religious.

For instance have you ever wondered why we cover our mouths when we vawn? Many people would suggest it is simply good manners to cover your mouth while yawning. While this may be true today, it is not true for the past. It was in the Middle Ages when people of faith began to wonder how Satan (evil and sin) entered our bodies. They concluded that the best time for Satan to enter was when we yawned, when our defenses were down – have you ever tried to stop a yawn halfway through? So to stop Satan from entering the body during a yawn the religious practice became the covering of the mouth. So to cover our mouths during a yawn, while good manners today, actually began as a religious practice.

Or have you ever wondered where the practice of hanging a horse shoe in your house started? Legend has it that Satan one day approached a man by the name of Dunstan (who would later be named a saint of the church), a blacksmith. Satan needed one of his hoofs re-shod. So Dunstan, while agreeing to do the re-shoeing for Satan, made the process so painful that Satan eventually cried for mercy. The legend tells us that from that moment on whenever Satan saw a horse shoe he would run off in fear due to the memory of the pain it evoked in him. Thus people would

hang horse shoes, not for luck as some would suggest, but rather because they believed it would keep Satan away.
