The shawls are then blessed, and are available for free to anyone who is experiencing illness, grief, stress, or is celebrating a milestone. You do not have to be a member of St. Francis Parish, or even Catholic, to receive a shawl.

A Message from the Prayer Shawl Team Coordinator:

The prayer shawl ministry is made up of individuals who enjoy knitting or crocheting. Each shawl is beautifully crafted in a unique and original design by the person making it. They are made with joy, love and prayer in every stitch and are donated to people for many different situations. Some of these include those in nursing or retirement homes, hospitals, someone who has lost a loved one or those who feel alone and need something to bring them comfort. The yarn used is either donated or supplied by the church, therefore there is no charge to committee members. We meet the last Wednesday of every month from 1:00-3:00 p.m. from September to June at the church. We also knit/crochet baby blankets and each child who is baptized receives one. You do not have to know how to knit or crochet, we can teach you! It is a wonderful group of people who socialize while working on their shawl.
