St. Francis Ministry Spotlight Sacramental Preparation

Volunteers of our Sacramental Preparation programs, assist the Parish Minister in preparing children and youth for the Sacraments of Baptism, First Reconciliation, First Eucharist and Confirmation, through in-person classes. This position can have many different roles including: helping to collect registrations and supervise classes, assisting children with activities during the classes, following the materials prepared by the Parish Minister and practicing to receive the sacraments with the children. Communion from the Chalice

This past summer, Bishop Crosby lifted all remaining COVID-19 liturgical protocols, including the restriction on receiving Communion from the Chalice. At all the Masses next weekend, the option of receiving Communion from the Chalice will again resume for those who wish to do so. As Catholics, we believe that "Christ is present whole and entire in each" (CCC 1377) whether we receive the Body of Christ or the Blood of Christ – because Jesus has risen from the dead, and his body is inseparable from his blood. But the Church also observes that "Holy Communion has a fuller form as a sign when it takes place under both kinds" (GIRM 281), reminding us more clearly of the Last Supper, and of the new and eternal Covenant established in his blood, poured out for us. We ask that everyone continue to respect everyone's privacy of health information, and decisions based on their level of comfort.
